ABOUT US

Organizing Department: The Government Medical College, Srinagar was established in 1959. It is the first and oldest Medical College in Kashmir. The Department of Community Medicine (Social and Preventive Medicine) was established in the same year with Dr. E. Anantha Rao as the first Head of Department (1959-1960). Looking back, department is being headed by seven HOD's before the charge was taken by the present Head of Department Dr. S. Muhammad Salim Khan on 1st May 2014. The Department is actively involved in MBBS, MD and para-medical teaching and training programmes. It has one health block in Srinagar, Block Hazratbal as its urban health block catering over 1.6 lac population comprising urban, rural and tribal sub-sets, with full-fledged administrative and financial control and have one SDH Hospital, 4 UPHCs and 12 HWCs. The rural health training centre at PHC

Khag, district Budgam also has Model Rural Health Research Unit (MRHRU), the only centre in J&K sanctioned by Department of Health Research, MOHFW, Government of India in



addition to CPHC Innovation & Learning Centre (CPHC-ILC) which is among few centres in the country. The Department of Community Medicine also publishes an official peer-reviewed journal titled Journal of Integrative Medicine & Public Health (JIMPH), published through Wolters Kluwer Medknow.

The Department of Community Medicine, GMC Srinagar also runs Urban Family Welfare Centre, Anti-Rabies Clinic, Yellow Fever Vaccination Clinic and Under-Fives Clinic at SMHS Hospital, the premier associated hospital of GMC Srinagar.

The Department has been conducted workshops on research methodology, qualitative research, SRMA and trainings on various national health programmes.

Host institute:- Established in 1959, Government Medical College, Srinagar is the biggest medical college in the region with MBBS, MD/MS and super-specialty course running successfully. It has eight associated hospitals spread within few kilometers from the colleges



providing specialized and super-specialized patient care to whole population of Kashmir division and referral services from Jammu and Ladakh regions, in addition to medical education and research The total bed capacity of GMC associated hospitals is around 3,000 teaching beds. It also runs college of nursing and para-medical sciences.

Srinagar:- It is the largest city and summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir and lies in the Kashmir Valley along the banks of the Jhelum River, and the shores of Dal Lake and Anchar Lakes, between the Hari Parbat and Shankaracharya hills. The city is known for its natural environment, various gardens, waterfronts and houseboats. It is also known for traditional Kashmiri handicrafts like the Kashmir shawls, papier-mâché, wood carving, carpet weaving, and jewel making, as well as for fresh fruits, dry fruits and world's most expensive spice. It is the second-largest metropolitan area in the Himalayas. The city is known for its nine old bridges, connecting the two parts of the city. Srinagar is also called the "Venice of the East and there are a number of lakes and water-bodies in and around the city. These include the Dal Lake—noted for its houseboats, the Nigeen, the Anchar, Khushal Sar, Gil Sar and Hokersar. Apart from these lakes, Wular Lake and Manasbal Lake both lie to the north of Srinagar. Wular Lake is one of the largest fresh water lakes in Asia.

Srinagar has some Mughal gardens, forming a part of those laid by the Mughal emperors across the Indian subcontinent. Those of Srinagar and its close vicinity include Chashma Shahi (the royal fountains); Pari Mahal (the palace of the fairies); Nishat Bagh (the garden of spring); Shalimar Bagh; the Naseem Bagh. Jawaharlal Nehru Memorial Botanical Garden is a botanical garden in the city, set up in 1969. The Indian government has included these gardens under "Mughal Gardens of Jammu and Kashmir" in the tentative list for sites to be included in world Heritage sites.

How to reach Srinagar:

AIR: Sheikh ul-Alam International Airport has daily regular domestic flights to & from Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Kolkata, Ahmadabad, Lucknow, Hyderabad, Kochi, Chandigarh, Amritsar, Jammu, Leh and can connect from other airports through connecting flights. The aerial view across Himalayas and Pir Panjaal ranges gives enthralling views of snow-capped peaks.

ROAD: The city is served by many highways, including National Highway 44 Kanyakumari to Srinagar via Delhi, Jammu), and travel enthusiast may take a journey through picturesque National Highway 144-D (Mughal Road). Travelers from Jammu to Srinagar on NH-44 may experience travelling across multiple tunnels, longest being 9 kms.

RAIL: The Srinagar is expected to connect to the national railway network by August 2024, enabling the delegates to travel from any station across the country to Srinagar by rail. Currently rail reaches to Katra/ Udhampur and then from Sangaldan to Srinagar. The intervening section is expected to complete by August 2024. The train travelers would experience traveling through 20 major tunnels and 158 bridges, T-50 being 12.77 km long, the longest one.

Weather during April in Srinagar: The days are surprisingly warm and the nights are also less cold than in the previous months. The average temperature recorded in Kashmir in April is between 14 degrees to 30 degrees Celsius, allowing the tourists to take part in various activities hassle-free.









CONFERENCE VENUE:



- No provision for images, diagrams, or tables.
- Font type in Times New Roman and 12 size
